Chaplain's Corner

Who Am I To Judge? Pope Francis

On December 18 the Vatican's Doctrinal Office issued a declaration that priests can bless same-sex couples as long as the blessing does not resemble a marriage or coincide with a civil union ceremony. Earlier this Fall Pope Francis said that civil marriages of same sexcouples are allowed. In this later case a legal/civil marriage guarantees that one partner can receive insurance and health benefits of their partner, be in the hospital room when the partner is dying or undergoing a serious medical treatment when access is limited to someone who has a legal or blood relationship.

The blessing is a blessing - nothing more and nothing less. The blessing affirms God's presence for them. Some may find this latest declaration a blessing and a freedom, while others may find this shocking. These declarations are meant to be signs of welcome and inclusivity of LGBT Catholics, who have often felt ostracized or excluded from a recognized membership in the Catholic Community of Faith.

"But the condemnation of homosexuality is in the Bible." Yes, but those texts in the Hebrew Scriptures are over a 1000 years old, when the cultural perception was that all gays are perverts. The perspective became part of the religious condemnation. Today pastoral theologians and psychologists affirm that people do not choose their sexual orientation. They discover it as the way they are made by our Creator God. Homosexuals are also "made"

in God's image and likeness." [Genesis 1] Many of us in the Knights have brothers or sisters, sons and daughters, and good friends who are gay. It is the way they are made. Pope Francis and many other religious men and women have taken the prophetic stand to recognize the goodness of gay men and women before God and the Community of Faith.


I realize for some this perspective may be very challenging and even threatening to your Catholic point of view and change may be difficult, but necessary for the sake of a welcoming and healing Church. Affirming the goodness of homosexuals is no longer just an individual perspective that one can take or leave. It is the perspective of the Roman Catholic Church. If you have gay relatives or friends, you might have a conversation with them about their sexual orientation and how they came/discovered that. Yes, there are homosexuals who are over the top, but there are just as many straights who are over the top! Please do not judge by one or two examples.

I have been the Chaplain of the Tampa Bay Catholic Gay and Lesbian Community for over 20 years. Until recently we have had Mass every Sunday at the Franciscan Center for over 42 years. I welcome your personal conversations and questions with me at any time.

Saint Andre Bessette – January 6 - Memorial

Saint Andre Bessette was born of a poor family near Montreal, Canada. He entered the Congregation of the Holy Cross in 1872, taking the name Andre. As a brother, he was assigned to be porter at the College of Notre Dame in Montreal. Brother Andre was known for his humility and kindness. More and more people were drawn to him as his humble prayers to St. Joseph, whom he had a great devotion to, obtained physical healings and conversions in the hearts of many who came to seek his assistance. "It is St. Joseph who cures," he said. "I am only a little dog.' Desiring to provide a fitting shrine for his patron. Andre raised funds by doing simple haircuts for students at five cents apiece. Soon, money was raised from wealthier visitors as well as from the common people. His reputation for healing and holiness was recognized far and wide. A chapel was constructed in honor of St. Joseph and Brother Andre was assigned as its caretaker. It soon became too small for the many pilgrims who were flocking to the little church. Oratory of St. Joseph on the top of Mount Royal was eventually built. The construction of the basilica began in May 1915 and was finally consecrated on August 9, 1943. The Basilica as it stands today was completed after the Second World War. The Oratory Dome is the third largest of its kind in the world after St. Peter's in Rome. Saint Andre died in 1937 and was canonized in 2010.



Happy New Year! I hope all of you had a joyous and Merry Christmas.

All of us start the new year afresh. We make resolutions. Let's plan now to look back at the end of 2024 and be able to say, "I kept those resolutions to improve myself, to improve my relationship with my family and friends, and my relationship with God!" An improved prayer life is the goal of many. I know I've made that resolution almost every year. Some years I do better than others.

But here are few things I've found about making resolutions that helped me.

First, I don't want to make a resolution that is not possible to keep. I've got to be realistic. I can't go to an extreme. For example, to improve my prayer life, I can't go from praying for 15 minutes in the morning to reading a chapter of the Bible, attending daily Mass, reciting the rosary, and saying the Liturgy of the Hours each day. For me, that's too much of a jump. I'm going to follow that for a day or two and then something will get me off track. Myself, I need to take baby steps. Maybe start with saying the rosary each day. I've got to make my resolution achievable.

The same is true of all those other resolutions we make.

I can't go from being a couch potato to running six miles a day...but I could start by walking a mile each day as an achievable step in that direction.

I can't starve myself trying to lose weight...but I could cut out snacks between meals as a start. Again, an achievable step.

You get the idea. The resolution should be reasonable, achievable, and specific.

Now here is one resolution that is reasonable, achievable, and specific: Resolve to meet with me to update the information on your family's financial needs analysis. (Or maybe you need to complete a financial needs analysis.) Let's see where you stand. Your financial health is critical to your family's future security. As your field agent I'm

Pass this information to any Knight that wishes to advance to the 4th Degree. Refer all interested to me and I will start the process for them.







Heal Family Wounds

Psalm 51 is a lamentation of David and perfect reading for the theme of healing family wounds. It reveals something that I never recall hearing about David. I recall him being chosen by God, a handsome and ruddy youth. However, among his lamentations he is very thorough in recognizing his own guilt and pleading for forgiveness. However, he also reveals that he was born in guilt, and, in sin, his mother conceived him. Psalm 69 develops this further in terms of his rejection by his family throughout his youth. Thus, the need not only for personal healing but family healing. As we know, many families suffer in some way because of a variance from God's word, the breaking of a vow or the betrayal of trust. This month actively pray for healing and work on it as needed.



Psalm 51

For the leader. A psalm of David, when Nathan the prophet came to him after he had gone into Bathsheba. Have mercy on me, God, in accord with your merciful love; in your abundant compassion blot out my transgressions. Thoroughly wash away my guilt; and from my sin cleanse me. For I know my transgressions; my sin is always before me. Against you, you alone have I sinned; I have done what is evil in your eyes. So that you are just in your word, and without reproach in your judgment. Behold, I was born in guilt, in sin my mother conceived me. Behold, you desire true sincerity; and secretly you teach me wisdom. Cleanse me with hyssop, that I may be pure; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow. OYou will let me hear gladness and joy; the bones you have crushed will rejoice. Turn away your face from my sins; blot out all my iniquities. A clean heart create for me, God; renew within me a steadfast spirit. Do not drive me from before your face, nor take from me your holy spirit. Restore to me the gladness of your salvation; uphold me with a willing spirit. I will teach the wicked your ways, that sinners may return to you. Rescue me from violent bloodshed, God, my saving God, and my tongue will sing joyfully of your justice. Lord, you will open my lips; and my mouth will proclaim your praise. For you do not desire sacrifice* or I would give it; a burnt offering you would not accept. My sacrifice, O God, is a contrite spirit; a contrite, humbled heart, O God, you will not scorn. *Treat Zion kindly according to your good will; build up the walls of Jerusalem. Then you will desire the sacrifices of the just, burnt offering and whole offerings; then they will offer up young bulls on your altar.



Are You Worthy

The Season of Advent is arguably the most important in our liturgical year and as Catholics. For without the birth of Christ there would be no salvation and maybe no liturgical year for that matter. The Advent Season is marked by many important events. As we know three of the four Sunday's purple vestments are worn as the world is in darkness. However, on the third Sunday we are told to "Rejoice (Gaudete) in the Lord always." The theme of the day expresses the joy of anticipation at the approach of the Christmas celebration.

I found the Gospel for Gaudete Sunday interesting. John the Baptist is doing his work in the Jordan and getting peppered with questions on who he is, is he the Savior, and where does he get his authority. He defers the answers until some Pharisees were also sent. They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." Good answer. None of us are worthy. That is why this is such a joyous season and one that brings us God's unconditional forgiveness and love.

One the octave of Christmas we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. Without her yes, we would not have Christ's birth. The feast continues through the twelfth night or the feast of the epiphany.

Epiphany, also called Theophany, is a celebration of God manifesting as the baby Jesus and revealing Himself to the world. The holiday also marks the day the Magi, or the three kings, visited the baby Jesus in Bethlehem. Jesus' baptism is also celebrated during Epiphany. The holiday is also sometimes known as Three Kings Day.

Given these feasts I don't think it's too hard a reach to say they cover three of the four traits of our Church as One, Holy and Catholic (or universal). Given that it also covers three of the four pillars of the Knights of Columbus – Unity, Charity and the Fraternity of our Magi brothers.

From the Desk of Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly...

'Far Beyond Pearls'

Spousal love and support, epitomized by the late Ann Dechant, make our work as Knights of Columbus possible

Last month, on the feast of All Souls, I had the great honor to deliver the eulogy at the funeral of Ann L. Dechant, wife of the Order's 12th and longest-serving supreme knight, Virgil C. Dechant. For nearly seven decades, Ann supported Virgil as he rose through the ranks of the Knights of Columbus. And for 23 years, she was at his side as he led the Order. In their relationship, every Knight — and every wife of a Knight — saw a Christian marriage *par excellence*. Virgil and Ann shaped the Knights of Columbus for the better — and always as a team.

Ann Dechant had a servant's heart — and sacrificed for her family and the Order without complaint. Raised on a farm in Kansas, she left her home state to move to far-off Connecticut when Virgil was appointed supreme secretary in 1967. She cared for her young children and raised them to know and love Christ, all the while assisting her husband as he led a growing, global organization. And even as she kept the home fires burning, she was often expected to be with Virgil as he traversed the globe.

In many ways, Ann had an impossible task, yet her example reminds us that with God all things are possible (Mt 19:26). She was held in high esteem by presidents and popes. St. John Paul II appointed her to the Pontifical Council for the Family. But while she moved in high circles, she never lost the common touch or her Kansas kindness. She juggled the competing demands of her life with grace and prayer — and with a trusting devotion to our Blessed Mother. In doing this, she set an example for future generations of Knights and their wives.

Ann's sacrifice typifies the sacrifice that so many of our wives make for us as Knights and for the Order. So much of what we do as Knights would not be possible without the support and dedication of our wives. Speaking for myself, I can honestly say that I couldn't do what I do without my wife, Vanessa. Her steadfast love and support — for me and for our children — allow me to carry out my responsibilities to the Order and the Church.

The same is true for so many Knights Order-wide. The Knights of Columbus is and always will be a fraternal organization of men, but the reason we exist, the reason Blessed Michael McGivney established the Knights, is to serve the family. Our membership in the Order should make us better husbands and fathers, and many K of C activities involve the entire family. At the same time, our volunteer service can take us away from home on many weeknights and weekends, inevitably leaving our wives to adjust family schedules and juggle competing priorities. More often than not, our wives are called upon to go the extra mile to meet family obligations, while also serving as both trusted advisors and indispensable supports to us. In short, being the wife of an active, engaged Knight takes patience, teamwork, sacrifice and an understanding heart. It isn't easy, but it is worthwhile because our mission is worthy.

The Book of Proverbs affirms: "When one finds a worthy wife, her value is far beyond pearls. Her husband, entrusting his heart to her, has an unfailing prize. ... Her children rise up and praise her; her husband, too, extols her: 'Many are the women of proven worth, but you have excelled them all'" (31:10-11, 28-29).

The wife of a Knight is truly a "woman of worth." This Christmas season, we should all have gratitude in our hearts and — importantly — on our lips for all that our wives do for us, for the Order and for the Church. May the Holy Family, whose feast we celebrate Dec. 31, be a model and guide for us.



Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of our family. Enlighten our hearts and minds that we may live more fully this vocation to love.


In our daily life and work,

Prayer for the Canonization of Blessed Michael McGivney

Founder of the Knights of Columbus

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Blessed Michael McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. Through the example of his life and virtue, may we follow your Son, Jesus Christ, more closely, fulfilling his commandment of charity and building up his Body which is the Church.
