Contemporary Scripture Studies reminds us that the power of the Gospel texts comes in the meaning and not in the literalness of the Gospel scene. Most of us were taught to stay with the literalness. Yet if the scriptures are just about literalness, why are there so many differences in biblical scenes? The writers edited their tests to bring out a particular meaning and a particular theology. Thus, the Ascension is not so much about Jesus rising upward. The Community has to get Jesus off stage. If he stayed around, the disciples would be constantly looking to Jesus to tell them what to do, Jesus wanted them and now us to take ownership and responsibility for the Mission NOW!

Pentecost means that the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Jesus, is everywhere and not limited to one physical place - be it Jerusalem, Rome, New York, or wherever.



Saint for the Month of June

Saint Charles Lwanga and Companions – June 3, 2024 This feast celebrates the African martyrs Charles Lwanga and twenty-nine others executed in the years 1885 to 1887 in Uganda. The efforts of the Society of the Missionaries of Africa, also known as the White Fathers. had converted a number of young men and boys at the court of the tribal lord, Mwanga. In the habit of forcing himself on his young male pages, Mwanga found himself thwarted by their Christian virtue. In a moment of rage, he ordered them to renounce their faith or face execution. On June 3, Charles and seventeen companions, along with some converts to Anglicanism, were burned to death. 'A well which has many sources never runs dry. When we are gone, others will come after us," one of them had predicted. By 1890, there were some ten thousand Christian converts in southern Uganda.

May God guide us all and help us to do **HIS will** and help those in need of **HIS mercy**.



Pray For Israel. Pray For Our Country. Pray For Our Church

June 6, 1944 marks the 80th Anniversary of D-Day. The landing of 156,000 troops on the beaches of Normandy. Over 4,000 troops gave their lives that day which was the beginning of the end of Hitler's Nazi Germany, the cessation of the genocide against Jews in Europe and, ultimately, the establishment of the state of Israel on May 14, 1948. The first time in over 2,000 years that the last Jewish state under King Saul had existed. Recently I was honored to present an Extension of Remarks read on the floor of Congress by Congressman Gus Bilirakis recognizing a 102-year-old WWII parachutist and rifleman who was being honored by the Government of France with an award dating back to Napoleon as a Knight In The Legion Of Honor. He participated in Operation Dragoon in August 1944 which freed the Mediterranean Coast of France and its key ports. He then deployed north to take part in the Ardennes Offensive, Battle of the Bulge, and the Rhineland Campaign which crossed the Bridge at Remagen ending the terror of Nazism.

This experience triggered this input to reflect on our current state of affairs as it relates to our core principles of unity charity, fraternity and patriotism.

Pray for Israel

Once again, the concept of genocide has arisen and God's people, the people of Israel are the target. Our faith, our Christianity, our Catholicism links us directly with the God of Israel. The one, true God of all humanity. It is important that our prayers be FOR Israel and FOR the people of Israel. We are not praying AGAINST any other people or nation. We are praying AGAINST the evils of hatred, persecution and genocide. In our prayers, we also recognize our failings as people and sometimes nations but trust fully in God's unconditional love for His people. We pray for Israel with charitable intentions out of our unity and fraternity with our Jewish brethren.

Pray for our Country

As we look back those 80 brief years to the D-Day we remember they represent roughly a third of our very brief history as a country and are rightfully recognized as our greatest generation. They literally followed the singular command and experience of Christ to "Love another as I have loved you." The "as" can require great sacrifices including life itself. Similarly, over 240 years ago another generation fought and gave their lives to establish our country as republic as one nation, under God. In that declaration they recognized that we had been given certain inalienable rights by our Creator including life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. Yet today we "fight" to choose the right to kill over a million of our unborn annually. Our liberties to include freedom of speech and religion seem increasingly insecure under the growing weight of big government. And our pursuit of happiness is essentially being directed and controlled by lack of fiscal control and the seeming increasingly greed for individual and collective power among our elected officials at all levels. We pray for our country with charitable intentions for unity, fraternity and the patriotism intended by our founders.

Pray for our Church

Similarly, our church faces issues as the human race evolves and, in some cases, the concept that the Scriptures and some established church doctrines are not necessarily fully relevant in today's world. The evolution of transgenderism is one visible issue that has caused considerable controversy among church leaders as well as the "flock". Pope Francis has faced numerous other controversies resultant, to some degree, to his involvement in global political and societal issues including climate change and even pagan worship with the Pacahmama controversy. Yet, his answers are totally consistent as he states that he does not consider himself a ruler of the Catholic church but a servant of Christ in expressing His love for His people. We pray for our church recognizing that the word of God expressed in Scriptures. Old and New Testament, is timeless. Further, that I Corinthians 13 captures the essence of our humanity in these words. "In the end, these three remain – faith, hope and love - and the greatest of these is love. As Catholic gentlemen we pray our church out of love.

All this we do to Share Our Faith as called for by June's Domestic Church theme.

From the Desk of Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly...

'United In Prayer'

As sons of Mary and of the Church, Catholic fathers have a responsibility to lead their children to an encounter with God

The Church honors the Blessed Virgin Mary in a special way during the month of May, reflecting on her role in God's plan. We know that Mary was a woman of deep and faithful prayer who recognized the voice of God and said "yes" to his will for the salvation of the entire world. More than any other disciple, she also knows the voice of her son and leads us to closer union with him.

Following the ascension of Jesus, Our Lady gathered with the Apostles in Jerusalem as they "devoted themselves with one accord to prayer" (Acts 1:14). We later read that the early community of believers, united in prayer and filled with the Holy Spirit, were "of one heart and mind" (Acts 4:32).

This unity of heart and mind is precisely the unity that we, as fathers, should want for our families. And this means that the single most important task we have before us is to teach our children and grandchildren to pray — in union with the Church and Mary. This is the essence of our mission as fathers. More than just attending to our children's physical needs, our role is to be the provider of spiritual food and shelter.

So, how can we do this? First, recall the maxim, "You cannot give what you do not have." To be authentic teachers of prayer and to reflect the love of God the Father, we need to spend time in personal prayer every day.

For many of us, this is best done in the early morning when we are fresh and the house is quiet. God is found in that "still small voice" (1 Kgs 19:12), and he waits for silence to reveal himself to us. In our prayer we should ask the Lord to make us good examples for our children. We should pray for our wife, asking the Lord to bless her and to bring about greater unity in our marriage. And we should pray for our children by name, talking to God about each of them and asking for concrete assistance for their specific needs.

We should also pray *with* our families, leading them in prayer. This means, most importantly, bringing them to Mass every Sunday, as well as teaching them the ancient and beautiful prayers of the Church.

Praying together before meals and celebrating feast days and liturgical seasons can foster awareness of God's presence. A family rosary — or even just a decade, depending on the circumstances — can bring Mary's peaceful intercession to your family, and it will equip your children from a young age with this powerful tool of prayer.

Still more, going to confession and participating in Eucharistic adoration with your children sets an important example and begins to foster habits in them for life.

Prayer is more than an exercise; it's a living relationship with our Lord. Leading your family in spontaneous prayers from the heart — prayers of petition and thanksgiving — can be especially powerful. If your children hear you pray in this way, it becomes natural for them to do so as well — and prayer becomes a personal encounter with the living God.

In a message to families in 2021, Pope Francis reminded us, "The family is alive if it is united in prayer. The family is strong if it rediscovers the Word of God and the providential value of all its promise."

The greater the demands that are upon us, and the more our wives and children depend on us, the greater need we have for prayer. It is indispensable if we are to fulfill our mission as fathers.

May the Blessed Virgin Mary, who pondered all these things in her heart (Lk 2:19), intercede for us as we strive to keep our families ever more united with her son.



Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of our family. Enlighten our hearts and minds that we may live more fully this vocation to love.


In our daily life and work,
