Hebrew Dayenu - for all of those wonderful examples we are grateful Knights and Ladies.



Saint Ignatius of Antioch Feast Day

Born in the providence of Syria, very little was known about his early life. He was a Christian writer and Patriarch of Antioch. While enroute to Rome, Ignatius wrote a series of Letters which formed a central part of the later collection of works by the Apostolic Fathers. His letters also served as an example of early Christian Theology and addressed important topics including Sacraments and the role of Bishops. Ignatius was condemned to death for his faith and was taken from Antioch to Rome. His date of death is unknown, but believed to be between 98 to 140 AD.

Brothers,

When Father McGivney founded our Order, a key part of his mission was to help Catholic families attain a secure financial future. It was a hard time and place to be Catholic, but he didn't want them to feel they had to let go of their Catholic identity in order to find that stability. He wanted them to see their Catholic community as a place of security – to know that here, their faith could grow. And here, their families would be protected.

In keeping with that mission, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly recently announced updates to our member benefits. Now, you might not even remember you have these benefits – in a sense, they're the best kept secret of the Order, but I'm going to do my part in making sure they're more widely known.

I'd like to highlight some of these updates, starting with one that affects all of us.

Whether or not you are an insured Knight of Columbus, you are entitled to the **Member/Spouse Fraternal Benefit**. This is an accidental death benefit for all members in good standing and their spouse. The benefit amount varies from \$1,500-\$5,000, depending on your age, whether you are insured and how long you've been a member.

The second update I'd like to call out is the **Family Fraternal Benefit**, which applies to insured members. It's guaranteed-issue insurance up to \$10,000 to any child under age 18, regardless of physical or intellectual disabilities. This also includes an automatic \$5,000 death benefit for children who die before age 61 days, including stillbirths from at least 20 weeks after conception.

Next is the **Orphan Fraternal Benefit**, which provides \$500 monthly to an insured member's child who has lost both parents, up to age 19. This benefit also includes up to \$5,000 per year in college scholarships, with a maximum total of \$20,000, per eligible orphan.

Finally, the **Widow Benefit** offers surviving spouses of insured members the opportunity to purchase life insurance, long-term care insurance, disability income insurance or annuities, and she and her children are eligible for scholarships.

On Gratitude – a personal reflection

At the heart of gratitude, I've learned, is awareness that all of life is grace. "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows" (James 1:17). Everything is a gift. Air, light, soil, water. Friendship, community, family. Food, wine, coffee (!). We live on a graced planet. Nothing is earned, nothing is deserved. All of life is grace.

And the grace of our Lord is wastefully generous. God could have made one kind of bird—instead he made 10,000 species of winged color. He could have made food taste all the same, supplying our need for daily nourishment—instead he created an environment that can produce the likes of curry, jambalaya, and apple pie. He made a world where ants build hills, water falls from the sky, and leaves change colors and regenerate in a matter of months. There is enough wonder and delicious diversity in our world to keep a person in awe for a lifetime.

The degree to which we are aware of this truth is a measure of our gratitude. Plenty of people notice our world, but gratitude goes beyond observation to receiving reality as a gift. It was the original lie of the serpent that God is distant and uncaring, and that we humans should go it alone. This is still the lie that humans believe; in fact, in our culture we are taught that independence and self-sufficiency make for the good life. But the truth is the opposite—dependence on the all-sufficient Father makes for the good life. The grateful person lives in total awareness and reliance on the Father's good gifts every moment.

A breakthrough came for me when I realized that gratitude is not a passive disposition but a learned habit. It is a discipline of awareness to the Father's grace and our own response to it. Paul commands, "Give thanks in all circumstances." (1 Thess. 5:18). Or just simply, "Be thankful" (Col. 4:2). I think I always considered gratefulness as something that happened to you when a happy, positive circumstance occurred. But Paul suggests exactly the opposite: the discipline of gratitude in the midst of any circumstance leads to joy. It is not the happy person who is grateful—it is the grateful person who is happy, whose eyes are open to the abundance of all things.

So how has this changed my life? On waking, I let my first words be words of thanksgiving. "Thank you Father, thank you Son, thank you Spirit..." Waking from sleep and having a new day to live in the mercy of the gospel is an amazing gift in itself. Then, throughout the day, I look for cues that prompt thanksgiving. My friend Bob Stamps taught me a simple prayer to utter every time you experience even the smallest good: a text from a friend, a sip of coffee, light filtering through the trees. "Hear the praise of this grateful heart" is a prayer that I now use innumerable times throughout the day. Before bedtime, I try to conduct a brief review of the day, what some have called the practice of "Examen." Doing so helps me remember the gifts of the day and to close my hours with thanks. I don't always keep these habits, but even the sporadic discipline of gratitude has awakened me to the Father's love and the gift of ordinary life. As Diana Butler Bass writes, "Everything is a gift. The degree to which we are awake to this truth is a measure of gratefulness, and gratefulness is a measure of our aliveness."



From 9-9-24 LifeSite News: Ten states officially have a proposed constitutional amendment regarding abortion on the ballot in November 2024. In varying degrees, many of these amendment proposals would codify the right to abortion – the right to kill unborn babies – across these states where any previous state laws protecting unborn life, and many regulations protecting women would be stripped away. The states that have the abortion issue on this year's ballot are Arizona, Colorado, <u>Florida</u>, Maryland, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New York, and South Dakota.

Since 2022, voters in California, Michigan, Ohio, and Vermont have all codified abortion as a "fundamental right" in their state constitutions. As a result, there are few restrictions to abortion in these states.

On the other hand, in 2018, voters in Alabama, Louisiana, and West Virginia also amended their constitutions in favor of protecting unborn life. The people of Alabama guaranteed a right to life for the unborn and both the people of Louisiana and West Virginia declared there was no right to abortion in their state constitutions. These three states now protect women and babies with near-total abortion bans.

I also encourage you to spend time on this website. The one story that I reviewed was an interview of Gary Sinise on the death of his son Mac, who recently died of a rare cancer. Mac was 31. Gary's advice is good for all us: "Don't let things paralyze you; You got to get into the Fight!" The Gary Sinise Foundation is very huge. The website has all their initiatives, and what they are involved with. Impressive, and worthy of our support! In their 990 tax filing for 2021, for 1-1-2021 through 12-31-21, they record donations of \$55.7 billion dollars. Another thing that impressed me, was that all 10 (ten) Directors and Trustees of the Foundation. including Gary Sinise, take no compensation. This tax filing also identifies 12 admin staff, but 5 moved on from the organization during 2021. The total compensation for the 7 FTE (full-time equivalent) personnel was \$1.6 million, or an average of \$226,915 per person.

Permit me to plug another way to donate to this 501-c-3 charitable Foundation, EIN 80-0587086, that will help John "JT" Doody. And that is by way of a Qualified Charitable Donation, or QCD. There is a Donation Form, available from the Foundation website, that you can download, print and complete, and turn in with your check to the Assembly. In this way, the Assembly/Council can claim your donation towards the grand total of funds raised this year.

One Nation, Under God, with Liberty and Justice for all!

I was struck by the readings for the Mass of September 1, the day prior to Labor Day when we take the opportunity to reflect on our blessings as a nation. Sadly, our nation at this point, 248 years in is one full of divisiveness, anger, hate and dysfunction. In less than 35 days from your reading this, we will hold, arguably, the most significant election in our history. In our Declaration of Independence, we proudly believe that our rights come from our Creator not the government. Especially a government that ruled with fear and tyranny. We are told if we follow those commands, it will give evidence of our wisdom and intelligence to the nations. What great nation has the LORD, our God, so close to us? What great nation has statutes and decrees that are as just as this whole law which I am setting before you today. You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition." He summoned the crowd again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile. "From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit. licentiousness. envy, blasphemv. arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within, and they defile."

So, where do we stand as a nation which believed in the rights of our Creator at its founding? Do we still have that belief? Have we become so involved in partisan politics, that like the Pharisees, we have become hypocritical and defiled I our practices? Christ tells us that evil cannot be imposed from without. Evil comes from within us. Read carefully what evil thoughts produce. Understand fully your position when you enter the voting booth. Are you making your decision based on party, personalities or God given principles. Choose wisely and patriotically.

From the Desk of Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly...

Come and See

The recent National Eucharistic Congress underscores our responsibility to invite others to an encounter with Christ

Perhaps the best part of being the supreme knight is hearing the gratitude of others for everything that Knights of Columbus do. I experienced a unique example of this privilege at the <u>National Eucharistic Congress</u> in Indianapolis in July. Not only was it powerful; it was completely unexpected.

I was standing backstage, preparing to give brief remarks to the crowd in Lucas Oil Stadium. On the stage, in the flow of her comments, the emcee mentioned the Knights of Columbus as one of the leading sponsors of the congress. The audience — more than 50,000 strong — erupted in spontaneous applause. The emcee was caught off guard and had to wait for the applause to die down before continuing.

The outpouring of appreciation was deeply moving. Of course, the organizers and the U.S. bishops know how much we helped to make the congress happen — how we sponsored the gathering, participated in the four cross-country pilgrimages, and assisted through the work of our councils.

But those tens of thousands in the audience? Relatively few of them knew about our specific contributions to the congress. Nor do many realize how much we do around the world. But they do know something — or should I say *someone*, in their local communities. They know *you*, my brother Knights, and they see what you do, day in and day out.

They see you seating people for Mass or taking up the collection — being the strong right arm of your parish priest and helping with whatever he needs. They see you putting coats on kids and raising funds to support the local pregnancy center. They see you going "to the peripheries," serving the most vulnerable and putting your faith into action for the sake of others.

They see you strengthening families, starting with your own, and helping men become better husbands and fathers. And they see you supporting the Church and sharing your faith just by being who you are. That's why the arena broke into applause — not because they see everything we do, but because they see what each of *you* do.

As I reflected on this and on my experience at the congress, I was also reminded of our duty to continue our work — and indeed, to multiply it. This event was a special moment for the Church in the United States. But the revival of love for our Lord in the Eucharist has to be an ongoing movement for Knights and their families everywhere.

How do we take the grace that came from the congress and carry it into our homes, our parishes and our communities? The first and best answer is to continue to do what we are already doing, always with a clear sense of whom we are doing it for — Jesus, our Eucharistic Lord. In all of our activities, the most important thing we can do is to bear witness to Christ.

But we can also do more. I encourage every Knight of Columbus family to take seriously the challenge from our bishops to <u>invite just one person back</u> to regular attendance of Sunday Mass. Reach out to that friend, family member, even that child or grandchild. Invite them, too, to Eucharistic adoration or a Eucharistic procession. Let's not just help make these events possible in our parishes. Let's fill the pews and streets with people who have never been to one, or who have not been in a long time.

It's a simple matter of invitation. Like Jesus said to his first disciples (Jn 1:39) or the woman at the well said to her neighbors (Jn 4:29), all we have to do is say, "Come and see." The rest we leave in the loving hands of Christ himself.



Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of our family. Enlighten our hearts and minds that we may live more fully this vocation to love.


In our daily life and work, May we reflect the self-giving love which you, O Father, eternally show with your Son and the Holy Spirit.


